
Chief Rabban Noble Dennis Thomas



Nashville is not that far away, I hope many Cahaba nobles and ladies can attend.



ISCA Lifetime Achievement Award – George Pipes

The ISCA Lifetime Achievement Award is an honor for dedicated service to the International Shrine Clown Association (ISCA). In order to be considered for this Award, the recipient's accomplishments must have been significant over many years. They must have been in keeping with the ideals and principles of ISCA and the ideals that ISCA is trying to promote.

While a member of the Ben Hur SREKOJ Shrine Clowns, George strongly supported the ISCA Sneaker Fund. The 2001-2002 ISCA President, Joe Cole, appointed George as a Sneaker Ambassador. He promoted the Sneaker when attending TSCA events. George started a fund-raising project that had custom leather fez cases made at a local prison and all of the profits went to the ISCA Sneaker Fund.

At the 2010 ISCA Mid-Winter Convention, in Indianapolis, Indiana, George Pipes was elected as ISCA 3rd VP. George quickly presented a proposal at the 2010 ISCA Fall Board Meeting, by his clown Unit at Cahaba Shrine, and a site was selected by the ISCA Board for the 2013 ISCA Mid-Winter in Huntsville, Alabama.

As an ISCA VP, George was instrumental in halting the skyrocketing ISCA expenses. If financial changes had not been made, ISCA would have been forced to disband by the end of George's year as ISCA President (2013-2014) due to lack of funds. During his time as an ISCA VP, George also helped revise the ISCA By-Laws, ISCA Officers Handbook, and the ISCA Competition Rules.

For three years as an ISCA VP, George served on the internal ISCA Audit Committee. ISCA failed to submit IRS-990's for 2007, 2008, and 2009. With the Internal Revenue review of the ISCA late IRS-990's submission, it was imperative for the 2010, 2011, and 2012 IRS-990's to be accurate and timely submitted.

At the 2013 ISCA Mid-Winter in Huntsville, Alabama, George was installed as ISCA President. During his year as 2013 ISCA President, many problems arose with the mailing of ISCA dues notices to Units and members and the timely deposits of dues and ISCA Sneaker Fund donations. As President, George assumed most of the duties as ISCA Secretary. He completely re-wrote the ISCA membership database which took many hours and days of his time. Dues packets were mailed to the Shrine Clown Units. He helped get replacements for expired checks that had been sent to ISCA, but not deposited.

Normally, the year after serving as ISCA President, the ISCA Board member can relax and unwind. George did not. He was elected as ISCA Secretary for 2014-2015 and served one year.

During 2016, due to ISCA Board resignations, George again stepped in to serve as ISCA Secretary for the second time. He continued to serve in this office for 2017 and 2018.



George loved to compete in Shrine clown competitions. He won many 2-man skit competitions with his SREKOJ Unit partner, Mike Ford. While serving as ISCA VP, President, and Secretary, George developed procedures to assist in the scoring of competitors in order to make presentation of awards run smoother at both the Mid-Winter conventions and the Imperial Sessions.

George has demonstrated his knowledge of clown competitions by having been asked to judge Shrine clown competitions, often on many occasions by ISCA, SESCA, SASCA, NASCA, and TSCA over many years. His judging has been consistent and considered fair by the comments that he made on score sheets to competitors.

Over the years, George has shared his knowledge of clowning, by participating in, or teaching seminar classes and by writing many articles for Clown Alley. He has also written many letters to individuals and Unit officers while serving as ISCA President and Secretary.

George has served as a Board Member of the Shriners Hospital for Children (SHC) in both Houston, Texas and Greenville, South Carolina for 12 years. The contacts and relationships with the Imperial Officers and the SHC personnel that George made during that time has been very beneficial to ISCA over the years.

George has always put both ISCA and SHC as being his top priorities. He has given up a lot of his time to ISCA while also owning a business and being a Board Member of the SHC. Over the last 12 + years, his vacations were used for ISCA and SHC events which has cost him thousands of dollars. Many of George's years of service to ISCA should be counted as 2 years for 1 year for the amount of time that he has contributed to ISCA. In my 34 years as an ISCA member very few ISCA members have contributed as much to ISCA as George.

I respectfully submit the name of **George "Patches" Pipes** to be considered for the **ISCA Life**time Achievement Award.



Did you know? Fez etiquette for every Shriner


Shriners International has adopted the fez as the exclusive type of head covering to be worn by all nobles when appearing as such. This means all nobles must wear their fezzes at stated meetings, ceremonials, Shrine parades, caravans, special Shrine events, and any other Shrine-related activities. The fez is never worn at a Masonic lodge communication or meeting. At non-Shrine functions where an Imperial officer is representing Shriners International, or a temple officer is representing a Shrine temple, he may wear his fez. However, other Shriners in attendance are not to wear their fezzes. As a noble, you are particularly admonished never to wear your fez in any company or place in which you would decline to introduce your mother, wife, sister or daughter. Never forget this. No other person is ever allowed to wear a noble's fez. The fez is not a display case or bulletin board. The Imperial Chaplain, potentates, divan members, past potentates, and Grand Masters may have their titles embroidered in small letters in gold or silver bullion, silk or rhinestone jewels on one line beneath the emblem on the fez. Active members of official uniformed units or official clubs of a temple may likewise have the names of their units or clubs on one line beneath the emblem on the fez. Any official appointee of an Imperial Potentate or potentate may have his title beneath the emblem as above for the term of his appointment. The fez shall be worn in its proper shape without crushing, creasing or alteration; and no device, ornament, title, wording or adornment other than allowed by Article 13 of the bylaws of Shriners International shall be permitted. Not more than two pins or clasps, without supplemental embellishments, may be used to secure the tassel in place. It is advisable that temples adopt a procedure whereby all fezzes are ordered through the office of the temple recorder. This will assure the purchase of proper fezzes, as many nobles are unaware of the legal restrictions. Thanks to Shriners International for this valuable information!

210.7 Code of Ethics:

The officers and directors of Shriners International, an Iowa Corporation, and all who may be elected or appointed to positions of authority, in order to discharge the responsibility bestowed upon them by the Representatives, and to maintain the integrity to the Order, and all Shrine Temples, their elected Divan members, their appointed Officers and all Nobility, shall abide by this Code of Ethics.

- (a) Obey the law of the land and the Articles of Incorporation and bylaws of the Order, adhering to the spirit as well as the letter thereof.
- (b) Demonstrate the higher standards of personal integrity, truthfulness and honesty in all their fraternal activities; administer the Order's affairs with impartiality, efficiency and effectiveness and in a manner that enhances its good name and mission.
- (c) Be certain that their information is accurate when speaking on behalf of the Order; disclose when they are stating their personal opinions; and be scrupulous in the representation of their authority and avoid misleading those with whom they deal.
- (d) Approach their organizational and operational duties with a positive attitude and constructively support open communication, creativity, dedication and compassion; bring credit to the Order by their public demeanor; accept as a personal duty the responsibility to remain informed on important and critical issues affecting the Order; and avoid accepting an assignment if they cannot effectively, competently and timely discharge the responsibilities of the assignment.
- (e) Exercise their independent judgment in the best interest of the Order, and free of compromising influences of loyalties; and act responsibly and in good faith, and in a manner not designed or intended to bring them personal gain from the discharge of their fraternal duties.
- (f) Give notice, in a manner consistent with the corporation's bylaws of any duality of interest or possible conflict of interest and make it a matter of record; give notice of any direct or indirect interest in an individual or organization which is proposing or is involved in a transaction with the Order; and, thereafter, refrain from voting on the matter or transaction.
- (g) Refrain from using funds or assets of the Order for personal gain; refrain from receiving anything of value for influencing their actions; and refrain from granting or accepting favors for personal gains.
- (h) Report the unethical or inappropriate behavior of Directors or Officers to the Board of Directors, when informed resolution is not effective.
- (i) Refrain from using their official positions or influence either for or against any candidate for public office.
- (j) Serve with respect, concern, courtesy and responsiveness, recognizing that service to the Order is beyond service to themselves.

325.11 Election Regulations:

- (a) Electioneering: A candidate of an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) **Expenditures Prohibited:** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) **Violation:** For any violation of (a) or (b) the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) **Notice:** At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.
